Our Story

Ashley Kanney, a mother of four from Dublin, started Feed The Kids Columbus (FTKC) in 2019 by organizing a food drive in her garage to provide "blessing bags" of food for 97 local students in need. What began as a one-time give has now grown into a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization serving 7,000 children in 25 schools throughout Greater Columbus.

Our Mission

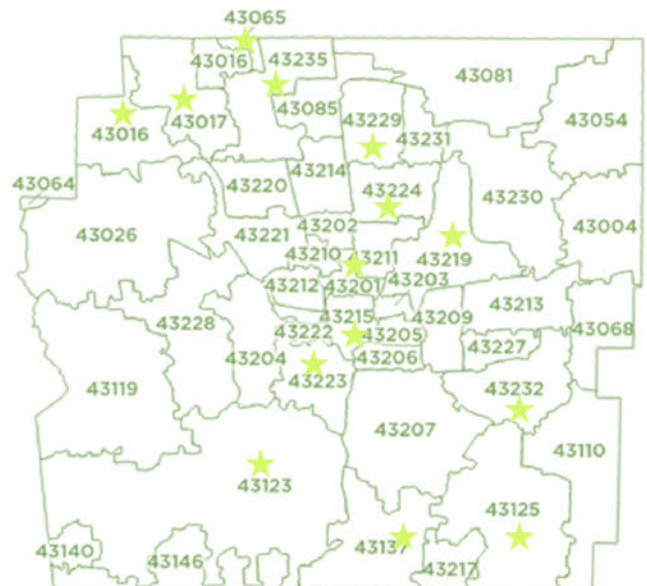
FTKC strives to ensure food insecure children in Central Ohio have access to nutritional meals and snacks, so they are able to learn and grow.

Childhood Food Insecurity Impacts all Central Ohio Zip Codes

Food insecure children benefit from free and reduced meal programs while at school, but often suffer from hunger while not in school, especially during extended breaks. FTKC works to bridge this gap by ensuring that kids have consistent and reliable access to food while they are away from school or even when they just need a little extra nourishment to help them learn and grow.

Serving Central Ohio

FTKC's 25 partner schools span 15 zip codes through central Ohio, supporting approximately 7,000 students in the 2022-2023 school year. Childhood hunger genuinely exists in all zip codes.



Our Programs

We take tackling childhood food insecurity seriously. Food fulfills a basic human need, but children who face hunger are dependent upon adult assistance. Facing hunger as a child can hurt their ability to grow both physically and emotionally, often impacting their long-term success. FTKC meets children where they are - at school. During the 2022-2023 school year, FTKC provided over 992,000 food items through two major programs, extended school break food bags and snack bags.

School Year Highlights



Highland Holiday Celebration

In December 2022, a holiday celebration was held at Highland Elementary School in Columbus' Hilltop community where students were provided food bags to take home over winter break, a pizza classroom party, and a visit from Santa provided by Romeo's Pizza.

Coloring Contests

Several coloring contests were held throughout the school year at partner schools with the winners receiving pizza parties for their entire class.

Spreading Kindness

FTKC provides easy opportunities for all ages to get involved and make a difference in our community. Children make Kindness Cards that are placed into food bags to bring a smile to students' faces.

Safelite Packing Event

In February 2023, 150 volunteers from Safelite Auto Glass assembled and packed 1,450 weekend bags for students who attend four partner Columbus City Schools.



Feed The Kids House Party

In September 2022, Danielle Fallon of Powell held an FTKC House Party in her home that welcomed over 30 women who donated more than \$3,500 to the organization.

2022 Bourbon & Bubbles

The 2nd annual Bourbon & Bubbles event was held at Prohibition Gastro Lounge in Powell in October 2022 raising \$25,000.

We pride ourselves in having volunteer opportunities for all. We have engaged with corporations, small businesses, youth teams, organizations, and families. We believe we make this world a better place by providing opportunities for people to give back to the community in a way that is easy and suitable for all.

FTKC has a large group of key volunteers that help with the behind-the-scenes work. In addition to our founder and board members, we have two key volunteer roles:



Agents of Kindness: administrative tasks, food procurement, warehouse management, delivery, and beyond.



School Coordinators: school partner who builds trust by being the liaison between FTKC and the school to ensure we are providing needed resources to students.

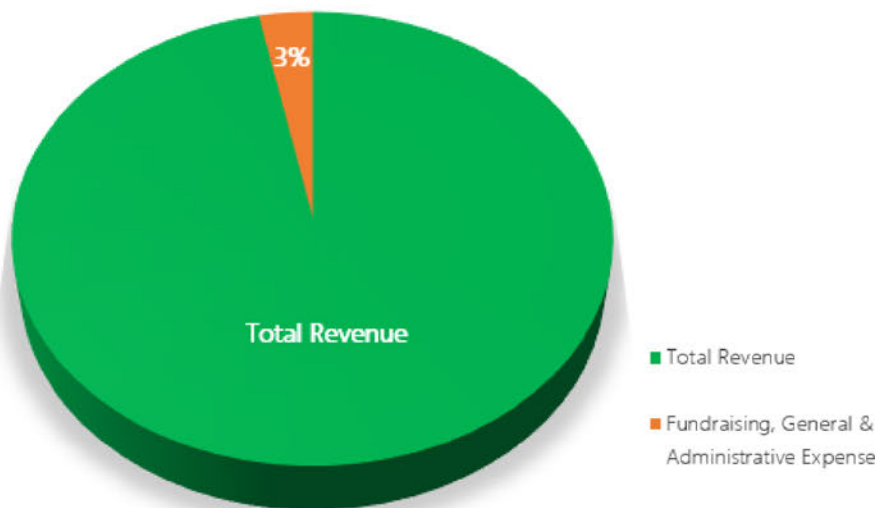

Financial Performance

With Feed The Kids Columbus running solely on volunteer support, 97% of FY22-23 revenue directly supported programming feeding hungry children. Simply put, our donors' dollars are maximized to directly serve our mission.

Feed The Kids Columbus (FTKC) required \$331,485 to effectively operate in its current state programming but aspires to expand impact through building more programming and adding partner schools. FTKC incurs a majority of its program expenses during the school year (August-May).

Up Next

During the 2023-2024 school year, Feed The Kids Columbus will expand by adding three additional Central Ohio schools.

With the onboarding of three new schools, FTKC will grow our reach to impact about 8,000 children.

All 28 schools will benefit from enhancements to the snack program, resulting in 150 more snacks provided per classroom each month.

Additionally, FTKC will pilot daily snacks for a Hilltop city elementary school aimed to improve low school attendance rates.

To deliver the school year's programming and enhancements, FTKC will need to increase fundraising by \$200,000.
